European Green Deal: H2020 call for proposals

- ► End April 2020: Discussed with MS
- ▶ **September 2020:** expected publication. Proposals will be submitted in late 2020.
- ▶ Original budget of 1 bn EUR might be reduced due to diversion of budget towards COVID-19 crisis
- ▶ A consultation on the content of the call should be open in May/June for a period of 3 to 4 weeks.

Horizon Europe latest updates: Strategic Planning

- ▶ Since February 2020, Commission services have been co-creating the structure and the contents of the strategic plan
 - ▶ Adaptation and integration of relevant points from the Orientations, especially the <u>targeted impacts</u> elaborated at cluster level.
 - ▶ Performing analysis using relevant points from the Orientations and additional intelligence to inform the directionality offered at cluster level.
- ▶ April 2020: agreement on outline and structure of Strategic Plan
- ▶ April/May 2020: presentation of first draft to European Parliament and Member States
- ▶ June: tentative web-based co-design exercise
- ▶ September?: second draft of Strategic Plan
- ► Goal to have the Strategic Plan adopted by the end of the year (depending on MFF and adoption of HEU legislative package)

► Key Strategic Orientations for R&I support:

- ▶ the orientations that we need to give to EU R&I investments to help achieving the EU priorities (including the post Covid-19 recovery)
- ▶ 10 KSO identified. To each KSO there are a number of Expected impacts for R&I Support associated

► Expected impacts for Research and Innovation Support

- ▶ the impacts have been identified through co-creation across EC services and co-design with the Member States, the European Parliament, stakeholders and citizens at large (principle of traceability),
 - paving the way along the key strategic orientations
 - structuring the work programme part for pillar II
 - contributing to the key impact pathways

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Horizon Europe Strategic Plan: main takeaways

- ▶ Different level of granularity: KSO > Expected impacts
- ▶ Cluster 5 expected impacts largely in line with main areas identified in "Orientations" document
- ▶ the KSOs are new elements that add a clearer perception of how the different clusters contribute to overarching policy objectives (cross-cutting and mission-oriented approach)

► Next steps:

- ▶ Next SPC meeting: an advanced draft of the plan will be presented in next SPC meeting; it will include the comments made by MS on the KSOs, the expected impacts and their connections
- ▶ 'Shadow' thematic configurations: one discussion on the expected impacts (on 15 May for cluster 5)



Horizon Europe latest updates: Missions (1/2)

CLIMATE NEUTRAL AND SMART CITIES

- ▶ 8 Mission Board meetings so far, several sub-groups discussions focused on mission scoping
- ▶ 1 meeting with Assembly and 2 meetings with SPC subgroup to discuss draft concept paper
- Several discussions with ongoing initiatives and relevant stakeholders both at Board meetings and by initiative of Board members
- Support to the Board by Foresight experts: input papers on key trends affecting transformation towards climate neutrality; development pathways and principles for shaping the transformation process.
- Several citizen engagement activities to be carried out; such as virtual events: Groningen, Netherlands (19 May 2020); Lille, France (25 or 28 May 2020)



Horizon Europe latest updates: Missions (2/2)

Next steps (for all missions):

- Mission Boards deliverable 2 (outlining proposed missions) end May;
- ▶ Refining the proposed missions, co-design sessions with citizens May to September
- ► Continuous interactions with SPC May-September
- ▶ Possible event with EP (ITRE) on Boards first proposals June/July
- [Preparation of the Strategic planning –Sept./October]
- Missions events at R&I Days (incl. missions hub 22-24 Sept & Handover of Mission Boards advice on missions to the Commission)
- ▶ [Adoption of the Strategic Plan incl. missions end 2020]
- ► Commission Communication on missions by end 2020
- ► Further refinement of Mission Board reports (new deliverable end 2020)
